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STIRLING CASA PROGRAM

Our individualized program helps each child develop physically, emotionally and cognitively at their own pace. The Casa curriculum is intended to build self-esteem, independence, physical development and to foster a child's natural love of learning. The three-year age grouping allows younger students to learn from older classmates, while enabling the older children to provide leadership and peer mentoring. Each classroom develops as a cohesive social community.

Practical Life

Children learn how to function successfully in their own environment. They acquire independence, coordination, balance, muscular control and develop concentration skills.

Sensorial

The sensorial materials respond to the child's sensitive periods for language and movement. The child develops and refines the five senses by classifying, contrasting and comparing colour, shape, smell, sound, texture, temperature and weight.

Language

Language work begins with Sandpaper Letters which prepare the child for writing and introduce phonetic sounds. The children move through materials that lead to reading and writing. Vocabulary, grammar, word study and creative writing are an integral part of our curriculum.

Math

The Montessori Math materials lay a sound number and geometry foundation. Math activities include numbers 1-10, the decimal system, teens & tens, memory work on addition, subtraction, division and multiplication and an introduction to fractions.

Culture

Subjects include Geography, Science, Botany, Zoology, History, Art & Music. Classroom materials introduce the child to our rich, cultural and natural worlds.

French

Twice weekly French lessons introduce the children to vocabulary associated with various themes such as colours, numbers, seasons, weather, plants and animals. Lessons are interactive, creative and include movement and song.

Music

Weekly Music class provides the children with an opportunity to combine music and movement. They learn songs, experiment with musical instruments and move their bodies to different rhythms and beats.

After School Clubs

Children have an opportunity to sign up for a variety of After School Clubs throughout the year. Activities such as yoga, dance, art, music, crafting, gardening will be offered by Stirling staff.

Nature Walks

We optimize the natural outdoor environment in downtown Milton to take Nature Walks where the students have an opportunity to connect with Nature and extend the culture curriculum.



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STIRLING ELEMENTARY PROGRAM

At Stirling we are pleased to offer both Junior (Grades 1-3) and Senior (Grades 4-6) Elementary programs. Students learning in our Elementary program work towards a common set of skills including; collaboration, creativity, leadership and academic excellence. At Stirling we are please to offer an extensive French program which includes daily French lessons, a STEM hands on component, gym classes that includes swimming, soccer, tennis and yoga. Field trips are planned each term in order to enhance in-class learning. After school clubs are run by Stirling staff, these programs allow students to become involved in activities that interest them outside of the classroom.

Junior Elementary (Grade 1 – 3)

Core areas of study:

- Mathematics
- Language
- History
- Botany
- Zoology
- Geography
- Science.

This is the start of a period of imagination, reason, socialization and moral justice. Montessori education teaches children to think, not just memorize the facts. Hands on materials allow students to explore and become fully engaged in the learning process. Children work both individually and in groups and are encouraged to pursue their own interests and passions with the guidance of the teacher.
